## Residence move-in day: September 3rd

The big day is almost here! This special edition of Campus Connection has details and tips to help you find campus and help your student move into their residence.

Your student will receive their room assignment and move in time via their Queen's email address at 4:30 p.m. on August 25th. Please note that our residences are very full this year, and some common room areas have been converted to bedrooms to accommodate a larger incoming class. Because our

buildings are full with a waiting list, we ask that you do not call, email or visit us any with room change requests, as they cannot be accommodated.

Once your student receives their room assignment and move-in time, they should visit our website to learn about their building and download driving instructions, a move-in map, a zone card and a parking map. We ask that you use the instructions on your student's assigned building page, as many streets have been re-routed as one-way streets, and GPS/online maps will not be accurate.

## Before You Arrive:

- Visit our website to learn about **what to bring and what not to bring to campus**
- Ensure your student knows how to **prepare their computer** for campus
- Visit our **move-in page** before leaving for campus, to ensure that you have the latest details about move-in day.
- Make sure you are following us on Facebook and/or Twitter, as we'll be sending out live posts and tweets on September 3rd.
- Does your student have a food allergy? Make sure they contact us before they arrive (613-533-2953 or [dining@queensu.ca](mailto:dining@queensu.ca)) to set up an appointment to discuss their specific needs.

## When You Arrive:

- Follow the instructions from your student's building page to get to campus.
- Place your coloured zone card on your windshield so that volunteers can direct you.
- Watch for coloured zone signs for the correct route to your building area and follow signs and the police/volunteers. We'll also be tweeting and posting online to provide up-to-date information about lineups and available parking lots.
- Stop at your building, drop your student /belongings for check-in and proceed to a parking lot (3-hour time limit). Do not leave your vehicle-without a driver- vehicles left unattended will be towed to an outer campus parking lot.
- Once your student has moved in, say farewell and visit one of our short Parent Information Sessions. \*Note: There are no early arrivals available. Please do not arrive prior to 8:00 a.m., and do not park your car on campus overnight, as it will be towed.
