



Meeting Assignments

Residence Life creates a community environment where our students can feel a sense of belonging, build resilience, and be academically successful. We encourage the personal development of our community members by holding individuals accountable for violations of the residence behavioural expectations.

The Residence Community Standards, as a part of the overall residence experience, are designed to:

- Create connection and belonging within a safe and respectful residence community.
- Challenge residents to think critically, accept responsibility for their actions, and learn and grow from their experiences.
- Emphasize the rights, responsibilities, dignity, and academic pursuits of all residents.

Educational sanctions are designed to provide residents who have been found responsible for a violation of the Residence Community Standards with the opportunity reflect on their behaviour and the consequences of their actions. Educational sanctions are not academic assignments.

Learning Outcomes

Residents who complete this sanction will:

- Engage in a dialogue with a professional staff member at Queen's.
- Connect their finding of responsibility to the larger campus community that exists outside of the classroom.

Timeline

You are responsible for confirming and attending a scheduled meeting with a professional staff member at Queen's **within 10 business days** from the date on your Decision Letter.

Failure to complete this sanction will result in a follow-up meeting with a member of the Residence Life staff team.

Instructions & Deliverables

You will be contacted by the Residence Conduct Office for a 30 minute meeting with a professional staff member from Residence Life, Housing & Ancillary Services, Campus Security, or other campus partner. This one on one meeting is an opportunity for you to ask questions and engage in a discussion about the broader community. You may be asked to reflect on the incident in question or to set goals and/or priorities for the remainder of the semester. The Residence Conduct Office will receive confirmation about your attendance.
